Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment removes the General Fund appropriations in the bill to the Department of Public Safety which were for the one-time cost of acquiring a mobile thermal destruction unit to incinerate expired marine flares and for the ongoing maintenance. The impact on other programs and services cannot be determined at this time.
