13	Amend the bill by striking out all of section 3 and inserting the following:
14 15	'Sec. 3. 5 MRSA §6203, sub-§3, as amended by PL 2021, c. 33, §1, is further amended to read:
16 17	3. Fund proceeds. The proceeds of the Land for Maine's Future Fund may be applied and expended to:
18 19	A. Acquire property or an interest in property that is determined by the board to be of state significance under the guidelines of this chapter;

When interest in land is acquired with proceeds from the Land for Maine's Future Fund, fund minor capital improvements on such lands and on adjoining lands in the same ownership or under the same management to improve accessibility, as long as these improvements do not exceed 5% of the appraised value of the acquired property; and

When interest in farmland is acquired with proceeds from the Land for Maine's Future Fund, fund the development of a business plan and capital improvements to provide for the land's continuing use as a working farm, as long as these improvements do not exceed 5% of the appraised value of the acquired property. Capital improvements under this paragraph may also be made on adjoining farmland in the same ownership or under the same management; and
31 32 33 34 35	D. When land or interest in land is acquired with proceeds from the Land for Maine's Future Fund, fund minor capital investments in the stewardship and management of that land. Stewardship and management investments under this paragraph must be held in a dedicated stewardship endowment and identified for use on the funded property. Stewardship and management investments may not exceed 5% of the appraised value of the acquired property.'

The bill specifies the selection criteria with which to evaluate applications for protection of working farmland property under the Maine Working Farmland Access and Protection Program. This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, provides that consideration must be given to applicants from or serving underserved or underprivileged communities. The amendment also includes technical changes to reflect changes made by Public Law 2021, chapter 33. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.

#### iscal Detail and Notes

This bill establishes the Maine Working Farmland Access and Protection Program within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Foresty (ACF) to align the ACF's farmland conservation efforts with the Land for Maine's Future (LMF) program.

The ACF has indicated that it will not require additional staffing at this time. The bill includes ongoing Other Special Revenue Funds allocations of \$500 starting in fiscal year 2021-22 to establish the Maine Working Farmland Access and Protection Fund within the ACF to allow expenditure of contributions received from public and private sources to support the acquistion of access to working farmland.
