 - Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §4713 is enacted to read:

3 <u>§4713. Statewide employment projections</u>

A junior high school or middle school, when providing career or educational
programming materials and guidance for students and parents, shall include an electronic
link to the publicly accessible website of the Department of Labor, Center for Workforce
Research and Information containing statewide employment projections. The department,
working with the Department of Labor, shall develop age-appropriate advice for navigating
the website containing the statewide employment projections and shall update this advice
from time to time as needed.

12 §4730. Statewide employment projections

A secondary school, when providing career or educational programming materials and guidance for students and parents, shall include an electronic link to the publicly accessible website of the Department of Labor, Center for Workforce Research and Information containing statewide employment projections. The department, working with the Department of Labor, shall develop age-appropriate advice for navigating the website containing the statewide employment projections and shall update this advice from time to time as needed.

SUMMARY

This bill requires secondary schools, junior high schools and middle schools, when providing career or educational programming materials and guidance for students and parents, to include an electronic link to the publicly accessible website of the Department of Labor, Center for Workforce Research and Information containing statewide employment projections.

It directs the Department of Education, working with the Department of Labor, to
develop age-appropriate advice for navigating the website containing the statewide
employment projections and to update the advice from time to time.
