1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §13702-A, sub-§22**, as enacted by PL 2007, c. 402, Pt. DD, §2,  
3 is amended to read:

4 **22. Pharmacist.** "Pharmacist" means an individual provider of health care services  
5 licensed by this State to engage in the practice of pharmacy.

6 A. "Chain pharmacist" means an individual who is engaged in the practice of pharmacy  
7 within a chain; that is, where there is a corporate grouping of 4 or more pharmacies.

8 B. "Hospital pharmacist" means an individual who is engaged in the practice of  
9 pharmacy in a hospital setting.

10 C. "Independent pharmacist" means an individual who is engaged in the practice of  
11 pharmacy in an independent pharmacy; that is, where there are fewer than 4 pharmacies  
12 under the same ownership.

13 D. "Qualified assistant pharmacist" means an individual licensed by this State as a  
14 qualified assistant apothecary, qualified assistant or assistant pharmacist, provided that  
15 the license is in full force and effect, except for the right to serve as a pharmacist in  
16 charge.

17 **Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §13702-A, sub-§28**, as amended by PL 2017, c. 185, §1, is  
18 further amended to read:

19 **28. Practice of pharmacy.** "Practice of pharmacy" means the provision of health care  
20 services that include the interpretation and evaluation of prescription drug orders; the  
21 compounding, dispensing and labeling of drugs and devices, except labeling by a  
22 manufacturer, packer or distributor of nonprescription drugs and commercially packaged  
23 legend drugs and devices; the participation in drug selection and drug utilization reviews;  
24 the proper and safe storage of drugs and devices and the maintenance of proper records for  
25 these drugs and devices; the administration of vaccines licensed by the United States Food  
26 and Drug Administration that are recommended by the United States Centers for Disease  
27 Control and Prevention Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices, or successor  
28 organization, for administration to adults; the performance of collaborative drug therapy  
29 management; the responsibility for advising, when necessary or regulated, of therapeutic  
30 values, content, hazards and use of drugs and devices; the ordering and dispensing of over-  
31 the-counter nicotine replacement products approved by the United States Food and Drug  
32 Administration; and the offering or performing of those acts, services, operations or  
33 transactions necessary in the conduct, operation, management and control of a pharmacy.

34 **Sec. 3. 32 MRSA §13722, sub-§1, ¶B**, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 710, §5, is  
35 amended to read:

36 B. Establish the specifications of minimum professional and technical equipment,  
37 environment, supplies and procedure for the compounding ~~or~~, dispensing or  
38 administering of medications, drugs, devices and other materials within the practice of  
39 pharmacy;

**SUMMARY**

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This bill amends the definition of the terms "pharmacist" and "practice of pharmacy" in the Maine Pharmacy Act. It also requires the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Maine Board of Pharmacy to establish the specifications for administering medications, drugs, devices and other materials within the practice of pharmacy.
