The State shall provide necessary funding for the consumer assistance 4 program. 5 Sec. 2. Transfers from available fiscal year 2021-22 and fiscal year 2022-23 Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Bureau of Insurance, 6 7 Other Special Revenue Funds balances to the Department of the Attorney 8 General. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, on October 1, 2021 and 9 on July 1, 2022 the State Controller shall transfer \$200,000 from available balances in the 10 Bureau of Insurance Other Special Revenue Funds account within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation to the Department of the Attorney General. 11 12 Sec. 3. The bill also provides continued funding for the Health

Insurance Consumer Assistance Program in fiscal years 2021-22 and 2022-23 through a
transfer of available Other Special Revenue Funds balances from the Department of
Professional and Financial Regulation to the Department of the Attorney General.
