
SENATE AMENDMENT " A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 252,

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The amendment changes the bill to apply to property taxes based on the status of property on or after April 1, 2023 instead of April 1, 2022. The General Fund appropriation needed in fiscal year 2023-24 is not needed until fiscal year 2024-25.
