21	1. One member of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate;

30	Sec. 3. Chair. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the Senate member appointed by the President of the Senate is the chair of the task force.

- Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall review landlord-tenant statutes, licensing statutes pertaining to lodging facilities that are inhabited over 30 days, but less than 365 days, and any other relevant statutes, legislative histories, licensing procedures and Law Court cases and develop a plan to ensure safe and stable housing for persons in these lodging facilities.
- Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the Legislative Council shall provide necessary staffing services to the task force, except that the Legislative Council staff support is not authorized when the Legislature is in regular or special session.
- Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 1, 2021, the task force shall submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.'

#### **Fiscal Note**

Legislative Cost/Study

Legislative Cost/Study

The general operating expenses of this study are projected to be \$1,750 in fiscal year 2021-22. The Legislature's budget for the 2022-2023 biennium includes \$10,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 and \$10,000 in fiscal year 2022-23 for the costs of legislative studies, as well as \$21,260 of balances carried over from prior years for this purpose. Whether these amounts are sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature. The additional costs of providing staffing assistance to the study during the interim can be absorbed utilizing existing budgeted staff resources.

### Fiscal Detail and Notes

Additional costs to the Maine State Housing Authority associated with the Director or the director's designee serving on the task force can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
