COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 268, L.D. 681, "An Act Clarifying the Removal Process of Individuals from Certain Facilities Not Governed By Title 14 of the Maine Revised Statutes"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'Resolve, To Establish a Task Force To Study Safe and Stable Housing in Lodging Facilities'

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:

'Sec. 1. Task force established. Resolved: That the Task Force To Study Safe and Stable Housing in Lodging Facilities, referred to in this resolve as "the task force," is established.

Sec. 2. Task force membership. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the task force consists of 8 members appointed as follows:

- 1. One member of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 2. Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, including a member from each of the 2 parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature;
- 3. Two members who are representatives of entities knowledgeable about or involved in ownership of lodging facilities, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 4. Two members who are representatives of entities knowledgeable about or involved in tenant rights, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and
- 5. The Director of the Maine State Housing Authority, or the director's designee.

Sec. 3. Chair. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the Senate member appointed by the President of the Senate is the chair of the task force.

Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of task force. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this

1 resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative
2 Council once all appointments have been completed. After appointment of all members,
3 the chair shall call and convene the first meeting of the task force. If 30 days or more after
4 the effective date of this resolve a majority of but not all appointments have been made, the
5 chair may request authority and the Legislative Council may grant authority for the task
6 force to meet and conduct its business.

7 **Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved:** That the task force shall review landlord-tenant statutes,
8 licensing statutes pertaining to lodging facilities that are inhabited over 30 days, but less
9 than 365 days, and any other relevant statutes, legislative histories, licensing procedures
10 and Law Court cases and develop a plan to ensure safe and stable housing for persons in
11 these lodging facilities.

12 **Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved:** That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the
13 Legislative Council shall provide necessary staffing services to the task force, except that
14 the Legislative Council staff support is not authorized when the Legislature is in regular or
15 special session.

16 **Sec. 7. Report. Resolved:** That, no later than December 1, 2021, the task force
17 shall submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary that includes its findings
18 and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second
19 Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.'

20 Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section
21 number to read consecutively.

22 **SUMMARY**

23 This resolve establishes the Task Force To Study Safe and Stable Housing in Lodging
24 Facilities. The task force is directed to submit a report and any suggested legislation for
25 presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature by December 1, 2021.

Legislative Cost/Study

The general operating expenses of this study are projected to be \$1,750 in fiscal year 2021-22. The Legislature's budget for the 2022-2023 biennium includes \$10,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 and \$10,000 in fiscal year 2022-23 for the costs of legislative studies, as well as \$21,260 of balances carried over from prior years for this purpose. Whether these amounts are sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature. The additional costs of providing staffing assistance to the study during the interim can be absorbed utilizing existing budgeted staff resources.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

Additional costs to the Maine State Housing Authority associated with the Director or the director's designee serving on the task force can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
