

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment removes the General Fund appropriations to the Department of Health and Human Services of \$366,430 beginning in fiscal year 2021-22 for provider contracts to provide contracted case management services. The department has indicated that it can absorb these costs with funds held in its allocation plan.
