Sec. 1. Department of Education to amend rules. Resolved: That the Department of Education shall amend its rule Chapter 125: Basic Approval Standards: Public Schools and School Administrative Units to require standards governing air quality and ventilation for all public schools, including schools with mechanical and nonmechanical ventilation systems. These standards must apply to all public schools and must apply no earlier than July 1, 2022 and no later than July 1, 2026. The rules adopted pursuant to this section are major substantive rules pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A, and the department shall submit the provisionally adopted rules for final adoption to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs by January 4, 2022.

11 SUMMARY

This resolve directs the Department of Education to amend its rule Chapter 125: Basic Approval Standards: Public Schools and School Administrative Units to require standards governing air quality and ventilation for all schools, including schools with mechanical and nonmechanical ventilation systems. It requires these standards to apply to all public schools and to apply no earlier than July 1, 2022 and no later than July 1, 2026. It makes the rules adopted major substantive rules pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A and requires the department to present the provisionally adopted rules for final adoption to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs by January 4, 2022.
