Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 6054, subsection 4, or any other provision of law to the contrary, and in addition to any amount authorized by law to be transferred in fiscal year 2022-23, the Maine Municipal Bond Bank shall transfer \$700,000 by June 30, 2023 from the Liquor Operation Revenue Fund, established in Title 30-A, section 6054, subsection 1, to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund.

Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, no later than June 30, 2023, the State Controller shall make a one-time transfer of \$300,000 from the money received pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 203-A for antitrust enforcement or enforcement of the Maine Unfair Trade Practices Act to the Department of Education. The department shall use money received under this section to establish or expand:

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment eliminates most of the funding included in the bill but provides \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2022-23 (\$700,000 in General Fund appropriations and \$300,000 in Other Special Revenue Funds allocations) to establish or expand school-based restorative justice programs, mentoring services for juveniles involved in the juvenile legal system and, in collaboration with the Department of Labor, workforce development, educational and vocational programs for juveniles involved in the juvenile legal system. To offset fiscal year 2022-23 costs, the amendment includes a \$700,000 transfer from the Liquor Operation Revenue Fund and a \$300,000 transfer from Office of the Attorney General settlement funds.
