Resolve, To Study Streamlining the Background Check Process for State-licensed Professions That Require Background Checks

Presented by Representative McCREA of Fort Fairfield. Cosponsored by Representatives: ARATA of New Gloucester, BRYANT of Windham, O'NEIL of Saco, Senators: CHIPMAN of Cumberland, MIRAMANT of Knox. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

 Whereas, currently a number of state departments and agencies require background checks for their employees and contractors; and

Whereas, most of these background checks are ultimately conducted by the Department of Public Safety, State Bureau of Identification, and the process of requiring and obtaining background checks is inconsistent and confusing; and

Whereas, it is imperative that this confusion be resolved as soon as possible to ensure that the purpose of the background checks, namely ensuring the proper security of employees and contractors, is realized; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Background check study by State Bureau of Identification; definitions. Resolved: That the Department of Public Safety, State Bureau of Identification shall convene a study of the current system of background checks.

As used in this resolve, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

- 1. "Background check" means the taking of fingerprints and other criminal history record information by the bureau pertinent to the identification of individuals who have been arrested as fugitives from justice or who have been arrested or charged with any criminal offense under the laws of this State except a violation of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12 or 29-A that is a Class D or E crime other than an alcohol-related or drug-related offense or individuals who have been taken into custody for juvenile crimes under a uniform interstate compact on juveniles or who have been arrested or charged with juvenile crimes under the laws of this State.
 - 2. "Bureau" means the Department of Public Safety, State Bureau of Identification.
- **Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved:** That, in addition to an employee of the bureau involved with the conduct of background checks, the following shall participate in the study of background checks:
 - 1. The Commissioner of Education or the commissioner's designee;
 - 2. The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife or the commissioner's designee;
 - 3. The Commissioner of Public Safety or the commissioner's designee; and
 - 4. The Commissioner of Health and Human Services or the commissioner's designee.

The bureau may invite the participation of any other person the bureau determines to be necessary to the success of the background check study.

Sec. 3. Duties. Resolved: That the bureau shall study consolidating and centralizing as many state-required background checks required for employment or as contractors as possible, including background checks for teachers, state workers, persons

1 2	seeking Maine guide licenses and persons hired as contractors, including the statutory requirements for background checks.
3 4 5	Sec. 4. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 1, 2021, the bureau shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.
6 7	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.
8	SUMMARY
9 10 11 12	This resolve establishes the Background Check Consolidation Commission to study consolidating and centralizing as many state-required background checks required for employment as possible, including background checks for teachers, state workers and persons seeking Maine guide licenses.
