SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 208,
L.D. 821, "An Act To Improve the Investigation and Prosecution of Cases That Involve
Vulnerable Road Users"

Amend the amendment in section 1 in subsection 12 in the 11th line (page 1, line 24 in
amendment) by inserting after the following: "report." the following: Nothing in this
subsection precludes evidence submitted later than 60 days after the accident or incident
from being used in the prosecution of a criminal violation or civil violation.

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or
section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment makes it clear that evidence submitted by a law enforcement officer
later than 60 days after an accident or incident described in the committee amendment may
be used in the prosecution of a criminal violation or civil violation.
