HOUSE AMENDMENT "C" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 610,
L.D. 842, "An Act To Reestablish Parole"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of the emergency preamble.

Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 4 and inserting the following:

'Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 120 days following the adjournment of the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. After appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission. If 120 days or more after the adjournment of the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature a majority of but not all appointments have been made, the chairs may request authority and the Legislative Council may grant authority for the commission to meet and conduct its business.'

Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 8 and inserting the following:

'Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, no later than December 1, 2022, the commission shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over judiciary matters may report out legislation based on the recommendations of the commission to the First Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.'

Amend the amendment by striking out all of the emergency clause.

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.



Legislative Cost/Study

This amendment changes the report date for this study from December 1, 2021 to December 1, 2022 and adjusts the timing of appointments of commission members. The general operating expenses of \$2,750 for this nonemergency resolve are moved from fiscal year 2021-22 to fiscal year 2022-23. The Legislature's budget for the 2022-2023 biennium includes an estimated \$8,401 in fiscal year 2021-22 and \$10,000 in fiscal year 2022-23 for the costs of legislative studies, as well as \$31,260 of balances carried over from prior years for this purpose. Whether these amounts are sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature. The additional costs of providing staffing assistance to the study during the interim can be absorbed utilizing existing budgeted staff resources.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

Any additional costs to the Department of Corrections or to the Office of the Attorney General to serve on the commission are still assumed to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
