Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section

The bill expands who can conduct a post-admission examination and a post-admission discharge from the staff physician or licensed clinical psychologist to staff medical practitioner. This amendment updates the language referencing the certificate issued after a post-admission examination to correctly indicate that the certificate is executed by a medical practitioner.
