town to vote on the approval or rejection of those sections of this Act that amend the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, section 6205, subsection 1, paragraphs D-2 and E and enact Title 30, section 6205, subsection 1, paragraph F.

The subject matter of those sections of this Act that amend the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, section 6205, subsection 1, paragraphs D-2 and E and enact Title 30, section 6205, subsection 1, paragraph F must be reduced to the following question:

"Do you favor adding 2 parcels of land in the Town of Perry owned by the Passamaquoddy Tribe to the Passamaquoddy Indian territory?"

The municipal officers of the Town of Perry shall declare the result of the vote, and the town clerk shall file certificates of the vote with the Secretary of State within 10 days of the date of the vote. Those sections of this Act that amend the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, section 6205, subsection 1, paragraphs D-2 and E and enact Title 30, section 6205, subsection 1, paragraph F take effect for all purposes immediately upon their acceptance by a majority of the legal voters in the Town of Perry and their approval by the Joint Tribal Council of the Passamaquoddy Tribe as provided in this Act except that in no event may these sections take effect until 90 days after adjournment of the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.'

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

20 SUMMARY

This amendment requires the approval by the voters of the Town of Perry at a referendum for the addition of land to the Passamaquoddy Indian territory as specified in Committee Amendment "A." It removes the provisions of Committee Amendment "A" that provide that the United States Environmental Protection Agency, and not the State, has the primary authority to regulate drinking water standards within the Passamaquoddy Indian territory and that authorize the Passamaquoddy Tribe to seek authority from the United States Environmental Protection Agency to regulate drinking water standards within the Passamaquoddy Indian territory.

The required local activities in this bill may represent a state mandate pursuant to the Constitution of Maine. If the bill does require a local unit of government to expand or modify its activities so as to necessitate additional expenditures from local revenue, the state mandate provisions of the Constitution of Maine require either: (1) General Fund appropriations be provided to fund at least 90% of any additional necessitated local costs of the mandate; or (2) a Mandate Preamble be added to the bill and two-thirds of the members of each House vote to exempt the mandate from the funding requirement. If the bill does represent a state mandate and neither one of these actions occurs, the local units of government will not be required to implement the mandated activities.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill includes a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$900 in fiscal year 2022-23 to the Department of Secretary of State to reimburse the Town of Perry for the costs of a referendum election.
