An Act Regarding the Depth of Phillips Lake in the Town of Dedham

Presented by Representative O'CONNELL of Brewer. Cosponsored by Senator BALDACCI of Penobscot. 1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

3 **Whereas,** this legislation is necessary to provide the Lucerne-in-Maine Village 4 Corporation the authority to adopt at an annual meeting the height of the dam at the north 5 end of Phillips Lake in the Town of Dedham; and

6 **Whereas,** it is necessary for this legislation to take effect prior to the expiration of the 7 90-day period in order to ensure sufficient time for any necessary research regarding 8 seasonal changes in water flow associated with the dam; and

9 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 10 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 11 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 12 therefore,

- 13 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 14 Sec. 1. P&SL 2005, c. 17 is amended to read:

15 Sec. 1. Lucerne-in-Maine Village Corporation authorized to construct, 16 operate and maintain dam. The Lucerne-in-Maine Village Corporation in the Town of Dedham, Hancock County is authorized to construct, operate and maintain a dam at the 17 18 outlet at the north end of Phillips Lake in the Town of Dedham. The Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, chapter 5, subchapter 1, article 3-A, subarticle 4, the dam, 19 including any flashboards, must be constructed, operated and maintained at no higher than 20 227 feet above sea level as established by the National Geodetic Survey a height adopted 21 by the Lucerne-in-Maine Village Corporation at an annual meeting and at a width that is 22 23 no less than the current width of the dam.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation
takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

Under current law, the Lucerne-in-Maine Village Corporation in the Town of Dedham is required to construct, operate and maintain a dam at the north end of Phillips Lake at no higher than 227 feet above sea level. The bill removes that height restriction and instead requires the dam to be constructed, operated and maintained at a height adopted by the Lucerne-in-Maine Village Corporation at an annual meeting.
