SUMMARY ROS This amendment changes a statutory allocation, from the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 1 38, section 1612 to section 1613, to prevent a conflict with Public Law 2021, chapter 94. 2 The amendment provides that, beginning January 1, 2023, a person may not sell or offer 3 for sale in the State certain appliances or products manufactured on or after January 1, 2023 4 that are prohibited from sale in major substantive rules adopted by the Department of 5 Environmental Protection. The committee amendment prohibited the sale of such 6 appliances or products that were prohibited from sale in the State of California under its 7 8 appliance efficiency regulations. 9 The amendment also replaces the appropriations and allocations section. 10 11 (Senator BRENNER 12 COUNTY: Cumberland 13
