Culturally informed treatment and recovery programs. The commissioner 18 shall ensure that any residential or nonresidential treatment or recovery programs for a 19 person who has not attained 21 years of age provide for that person culturally informed 20 treatment plans and modalities and culturally informed community reintegration programs 21 and language services for that person and the person's family and support system. 22 Sec. 2. 34-A MRSA §1402, sub-§10-B is enacted to read: 23 10-B. Culturally informed prevention, diversion, restorative justice and reentry 24 and reintegration programs. The commissioner shall ensure that any prevention, 25 26 diversion, restorative justice or reentry and reintegration halfway house programs, including, but not limited to, case management, education, employment and community 27 reintegration programs, established by the commissioner for a person who has not attained 28 21 years of age are culturally informed and provide language services for the person and 29 the person's family and support system. 30 Sec. 3. 34-A MRSA §1402, sub-§10-C is enacted to read: 31 10-C. Culturally informed reentry and reintegration halfway houses. 32 commissioner shall establish and operate or subcontract with an appropriate entity to 33 establish and operate culturally informed halfway houses for persons who have not attained 34 21 years of age to provide housing services, referrals to community-based services and 35

supports and education and employment resources. The operation of halfway houses
established or subcontracted under this subsection may be funded from resources available
to the department, including any public or private grants, donations and other funding
received for this purpose. Grants, donations and other funding received by the department
for the purposes of this subsection must be placed in a separate nonlapsing account and
may be used only for the purposes of this subsection and in accordance with any restrictions
placed on the funds by the source of the grant, donation or funding.'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

10 SUMMARY

This amendment is the majority report of the committee. This amendment provides for the following services and programs for persons under 21 years of age who are in the custody of the Department of Corrections: culturally informed treatment and recovery programs; culturally informed prevention, diversion, restorative justice and reentry and reintegration programs; and culturally informed reentry and reintegration halfway houses.
