HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 760, L.D. 1022, "An Act To Make Agricultural Workers and Other Workers Employees under the Wage and Hour Laws"

Amend the amendment in section 5 in subsection 3-A in the 6th line (page 1, line 18 in amendment) by striking out the following: "40" and inserting the following: '48'

Amend the amendment in section 5 in subsection 3-A in paragraph A in the last line (page 1, line 26 in amendment) by striking out the following: "50" and inserting the following: '58'

Amend the amendment in section 5 in subsection 3-A in paragraph B in the last line (page 1, line 30 in amendment) by striking out the following: "45" and inserting the following: '53'


Amend the amendment in section 5 in subsection 3-A in paragraph C in the last line (page 1, line 34 in amendment) by striking out the following: "40" and inserting the following: '48'

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

The committee amendment provides that an individual employed in agriculture or an individual employed in certain activities related to agriculture may not be required by an employer to work more than 40 hours in any one week unless 1 1/2 times the regular hourly rate is paid for all hours actually worked in excess of: beginning January 1, 2022, 50 hours in that week; beginning January 1, 2023, 45 hours in that week; and beginning January 1, 2024, 40 hours in that week. This amendment changes the number of hours to: beginning January 1, 2022, 58 hours; beginning January 1, 2023, 53 hours; and beginning January 1, 2024, 48 hours.
