6 7 8 9 0	This amendment removes from the bill the increase of the square footage allowed to be disturbed and not revegetated in a calendar year and the total square footage allowed to be disturbed and not revegetated in order for new construction at or modification of existing development to qualify for an exemption from review under the laws governing site location of development. It also removes language that specifies that the addition of a dwelling unit does not constitute a division of a parcel of land.

This bill would amend the site location of development laws to allow for exemptions from review if specific criteria are met. The Department of Environmental Protection anticipates this change will result in a small increase in projects that would be exempted from department review. This will result in a minor decrease in application fee revenue and minor savings from the decreased workload.
