8 M. Freedom of access requests. The chief administrative officer of a municipal, county

15 **SUMMARY**

16 This bill requires law enforcement agencies to adopt written policies regarding the
17 unannounced execution of search warrants. Such policies must meet the minimum
18 standards adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Maine Criminal Justice Academy.
