SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 352,
L.D. 1091, "An Act To Improve the Long-term Outcomes for Youth Transitioning from
State Care by Raising the Upper Age Limit for Voluntary Support Eligibility"

Amend the amendment by inserting after the title the following:

'Amend the bill by striking out all of section 2 and inserting the following:

Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §4037-A, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2021, c. 535, §1, is further
amended to read:

1. Extended care requirements. A person who is 18, 19 ~~or~~, 20, 21 or 22 years of age
and who attained 18 years of age while in the care and custody of the department may
continue to receive care and support if the person:

- A. Is enrolled in secondary school or its equivalent or is enrolled in postsecondary or
career and technical school;
- B. Is participating in a program or activity that promotes employment or removes
barriers to employment;
- C. Is employed for at least 80 hours per month; or
- D. Is found to be in special circumstances, including but not limited to being incapable
of qualifying under paragraphs A to C due to a documented medical or behavioral
health condition.'

Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 3 and inserting the following:

Sec. 3. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and
allocations are made.

**HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, DEPARTMENT OF
State-funded Foster Care/Adoption Assistance 0139**

Initiative: Provides funding to raise the upper age limit from 20 years of age to 22 years of
age for voluntary participation in extended care for persons who attained 18 years of age
while in the care and custody of the State.

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
