1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 28-B MRSA §407 is enacted to read:
3	§407. Revenue allocation to municipalities
4 5 6 7 8	1. Local Government Marijuana Revenue Fund established. In recognition of the local costs of regulation and enforcement with respect to the activities associated with the legalization of adult use marijuana under this chapter and to assist in offsetting negative effects on local resources, there is established the Local Government Marijuana Revenue Fund, referred to in this section as "the fund."
9 10	2. Fund sources. The fund receives money transferred to the fund pursuant to Title 36, section 1818, subsection 1 and Title 36, section 4925.
11 12 13 14 15 16 17	3. Distribution of funds. The Treasurer of State shall transfer the balance in the fund, less the actual costs of administering the fund, on the 20th day of each month. Money in the fund must be distributed to each municipality in which the legislative body has voted to adopt a new ordinance, amend an existing ordinance or approve a warrant article allowing a marijuana establishment within the municipality, in proportion to the ratio of state revenues generated by all marijuana establishments operating within the municipality to the state revenues generated by all marijuana establishments operating within the State.
18 19 20	<u>4.</u> Unorganized and deorganized areas. For purposes of municipal marijuana revenue allocation pursuant to this section, unorganized and deorganized areas must be treated as if they are municipalities.
21 22	Sec. 2. 36 MRSA §1818, as enacted by PL 2017, c. 409, Pt. D, §4, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

On or before the last day of each month, the State Controller shall transfer to the Adult Use Marijuana Public Health and Safety Fund established under Title 28-B, section 1101 12% of the difference between the sales tax revenue received by the assessor during the preceding month pursuant to section 1811 and the transfer made pursuant to subsection 1.

38	§4925. Application of excise tax revenue
39 40	All excise tax revenue collected by the assessor pursuant to this chapter on the sale of adult use marijuana must be deposited into the General Fund, except that:

1	<u>1. Transfer to Local Government Marijuana Revenue Fund.</u> On or before the 10th
2	day of each month, the State Controller shall transfer to the Local Government Marijuana
3	Revenue Fund established under Title 28-B, section 407 5% of the excise tax revenue

2. Transfer to Adult Use Marijuana Public Health and Safety Fund. On or before
the last day of each month, the State Controller shall transfer to the Adult Use Marijuana
Public Health and Safety Fund established under Title 28-B, section 1101 12% of the
difference between the excise tax revenue received by the assessor during the preceding
month pursuant to this subchapter and the transfer made pursuant to subsection 1.

SUMMARY

This bill allocates 5% of the gross sales and excise tax revenue generated by adult use
marijuana establishments in the State to the municipalities where the revenue was
generated and makes a reduction to the amount deposited in the Adult Use Marijuana Public
Health and Safety Fund.

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
