The amendment requires the State Board of Funeral Service to adopt major substantive rules governing the safety of drivers of vehicles owned, leased or otherwise used by a practitioner of funeral service or a funeral establishment for the transport of human remains. It directs the board to work with stakeholders when developing the rules and to submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Innovation, Development, Economic Advancement and Business on the progress of stakeholders' work no later than December 1, 2021 and a provisionally adopted rule to the Legislature no later than January 1, 2023.
