2	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §131, sub-§3 is enacted to read:
3	3. Private counsel contingent fee agreements. Notwithstanding subsection 1 or any
4	provision of law to the contrary, the Attorney General may employ private counsel on a
5	contingent fee basis and may deduct from funds recovered by private counsel on behalf of
6	the State such amounts as the Attorney General determines are due and owed under the
7	terms of a contingent fee agreement and remit such amounts to private counsel.
