12	Amend the bill in section 3 in paragraph A-2 in the last 11 lines (page 2, lines 24 to 34
13	in L.D.) by striking out the following: "A law enforcement officer who is acting in the
14	lawful discharge of the officer's official duties without a warrant may disarm a lawfully
15 16	detained individual only temporarily and only if the officer reasonably believes it is
17	immediately necessary for the protection of the officer or another individual. Before releasing the detained individual, the law enforcement officer shall return to the individual
18	any seized firearm, ammunition or component of a firearm or ammunition, firearm
19	accessory, ammunition reloading equipment and supplies and any personal weapon other
20	than a firearm taken from the individual, unless the officer takes the individual into physical
21	custody for engaging in suspected criminal activity or for observation pursuant to Title
22	34-B, section 3862 or seizes the item as evidence pursuant to an investigation of the
23	commission of a crime."
24	Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section
25	number to read consecutively.
26	SUMMARY
27	This amendment is the minority report of the committee. This amendment strikes the

provisions in the bill regarding the circumstances under which a law enforcement officer, acting without a warrant, may temporarily disarm a lawfully detained person. FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED

This bill requires certain actions taken by the Governor related to a state of emergency to be approved by a 2/3 vote of the Legislative Council. The Legislature's baseline budget for 2022-2023 includes funds for the Legislative Council to meet throughout the year. Whether or not there are sufficient funds will depend on the number of times the Legislative Council is required to meet.
