An Act To Protect Medicare Beneficiaries from Surprise Medical Billing

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §2600-G is enacted to read:
3	§2600-G. Balance billing of Medicare beneficiaries prohibited
4 5	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
6 7 8	A. "Balance bill" means to charge to or collect from a Medicare beneficiary any amount in excess of the reasonable charge for a service, procedure or treatment paid to a physician under the Medicare program.
9 10	B. "Medicare" means the federal Health Insurance for the Aged Act, Title XVIII of the Social Security Amendments of 1965, as amended.
11 12	C. "Medicare beneficiary" means a person who is a beneficiary of health insurance under Medicare.
13 14 15	2. Balance billing prohibited. A physician licensed under this chapter may not balance bill a Medicare beneficiary for any service, procedure or treatment provided to the Medicare beneficiary in the physician's office.
16 17 18 19 20	3. Notice; posting. A physician who treats Medicare beneficiaries shall post a summary of the provisions of this section in a conspicuous place in the physician's office. The summary must include the statement that any person aggrieved by a physician's failure to comply with the provisions of this section may file a complaint with the board and must include toll-free telephone numbers to be used for this purpose.
21 22 23 24 25	4. Complaints; violations. An individual may file a complaint with the board seeking disciplinary action concerning a violation of this section. The board shall investigate or cause to be investigated and shall resolve a complaint on its own motion or upon receipt of a written complaint. The board shall conduct its actions in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act.

SUMMARY

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12 This bill prohibits physicians from balance billing Medicare beneficiaries for any 13 amount in excess of the reasonable charge for a service, procedure or treatment paid to that 14 physician under the Medicare program.
