20 21 22 23 24	This bill extends the application of the hate crime sentencing laws to a defendant who selects the person against whom a crime is committed because of that person's status as a law enforcement officer or who selects property to damage because of such status of the owner or occupant of that property. It also provides \$1,000,000 in annual funding for the Department of Education for programs that educate students to avoid using drugs.
