1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:					
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §2353, sub-§4-B is enacted to read:					
3 4	<u>4-B.</u> Community organizations; standing orders for nasal naloxone hydrochloride. If a community organization opts to possess and administer nasal naloxone					
5	hydrochloride at the community organization's facility, acting under standing orders from					
6	a licensed health care professional authorized by law to prescribe nasal naloxone					
7	hydrochloride, the community organization shall operate in accordance with rules adopted					
8	by the department and the provisions of this subsection.					
9	A. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a community organization					
10 11	may store at the organization's facility and dispense nasal naloxone hydrochloride and is not subject to the provisions of Title 32, chapter 117.					
12	B. A community organization shall obtain training in administration of nasal naloxone					
13	hydrochloride that meets the protocols and criteria established by the department. A					
14	community organization may seek out an appropriate training entity to train the					
15 16	organization's employees in the administration of nasal naloxone hydrochloride and overdose identification and prevention. Employees of the community organization					
10	who administer nasal naloxone hydrochloride and all other persons involved in the					
18	administration of the community organization shall successfully complete the training					
19	and possess documentation of having successfully completed the training from the					
20	training entity or community organization that conducted the training.					
21	C. A syringe services program certified by the Maine Center for Disease Control and					
22	Prevention or other entity that provides nasal naloxone hydrochloride shall provide					
23 24	unit-of-use packages of nasal naloxone hydrochloride to a community organization that has provided training described in paragraph B so that the community organization					
25	may possess and administer nasal naloxone hydrochloride to an individual who appears					
26	to be experiencing a drug-related overdose.					
27	D. For purposes of this subsection, unless the context otherwise indicates, "community					
28	organization" means a private or nonprofit organization operating a facility that serves					
29	the community.					
30	The department shall adopt rules to implement this subsection. Rules adopted pursuant to					
31	this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter					
32	<u>2-A.</u>					
33	SUMMARY					
34	This bill allows community organizations, which are defined as private or nonprofit					
35	organizations operating a facility that serves the community, to store and administer nasal					
36	naloxone hydrochloride upon a standing order from a licensed health care professional					
37	authorized by law to prescribe nasal naloxone hydrochloride.
