11	Amend the bill by inserting after the title and before the enacting clause the following:
12 13	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
14 15 16	Whereas, this legislation provides a clear and safe regulatory structure for educational institutions to conduct recreational trips, and this structure needs to be in place as soon as possible for the summer recreational season; and
17 18 19 20	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'
21	Amend the bill by striking out all of section 1.
22	Amend the bill by striking out all of section 9 and inserting the following:
23 24	'Sec. 9. 12 MRSA §12853, sub-§7, as amended by PL 2009, c. 211, Pt. B, §11, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
25	7. Exceptions. The following exceptions apply to the requirement for a guide license.
26 27 28	A. A person holding a youth camp trip leader permit under section 12860 may, without a guide license, conduct trips including adults under the auspices of the youth camp that employs those adults, subject to all the requirements of section 12860.
29 30 31	B. A person holding an educational trip leader permit under section 12863 may, without a guide license, conduct outdoor educational trips in accordance with section 12863.
32 33 34	C. Notwithstanding section 12863, an employee or a student of an educational institution may, without a guide license, conduct outdoor educational trips as part of the educational institution's programming as long as the educational institution's

	10 11	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
	12 13 14	A. "Educational institution" means a public school or private school, as those terms are defined in Title 20-A, section 1, a postsecondary educational institution or any othe educational institution defined by the commissioner by rule under subsection 6.

"Outdoor educational trip" means an educational or recreational outdoor trip conducted by an educational institution that includes nonmotorized boating or camping at a primitive camping area but does not include fishing, hunting, trapping or the use of snowmobiles, motorboats or all-terrain vehicles.

An educational institution conducting an outdoor educational trip shall provide for every 12 trip participants at least one educational trip leader who holds a permit under this section and who is associated with the educational institution or a person who holds a guide license issued under this chapter.

A person who does not hold a guide license issued under this chapte may not conduct an outdoor educational trip under subsection 2 without an educational trip leader permit issued under this section. Each day a person violates this subsection, that person commits a civil violation for which a fine of \$50 and an amount equal to twice the applicable license or permit fee may be adjudged.
	28 29 30	4. Issuance of permit. The commissioner may issue or reissue an educational tripleader permit to a person who meets the qualifications established by the commissioner by rule under subsection 6 and who pays the fee established under subsection 5.
	31 32 33	5. Fee. The initial qualifying fee for a 5-year educational trip leader permit is \$20 The permit may be renewed upon payment of \$20 if the requirements of this section including requirements in rules adopted under subsection 6, are met.
	34 35	6. Rules. The commissioner shall adopt rules to implement this section, including bu not limited to rules establishing:
	36 37	A. An advisory committee made up of persons with relevant expertise to advise the commissioner in the implementation of this section;

6 7	E. Any other standards, conditions or procedures necessary for the effective implementation and enforcement of this section.
8 9	Rules adopted under this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
10 11 12 13 14 15	7. Enforcement. Wardens of the department and the rangers of the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Forestry and Bureau of Parks and Lands may enforce this section and may terminate any trip that is considered unsafe or in violation of this section. The commissioner, who shall take into consideration the advice of the advisory committee established in accordance with subsection 6, paragraph A, shall establish standards for what is considered an unsafe trip and shall consider previous violations of this section when issuing or reissuing educational trip leader permits.'
17	Amend the bill by striking out all of section 11.
18	Amend the bill by striking out all of section 13.
19	Amend the bill by adding before the summary the following:
20 21	'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.'
22 23	Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.
24	SUMMARY
25	This amendment clarifies and streamlines the bill. The amendment:
26 27 28 29	1. Defines "outdoor educational trip" as an educational or recreational outdoor trip conducted by an educational institution that includes nonmotorized boating or camping at a primitive camping area but does not include fishing, hunting, trapping or the use of snowmobiles, motorboats or all-terrain vehicles;
30 31 32	2. Clarifies that the temporary authorization for outdoor educational trips to be conducted without permits applies to the same institutions and the same trips as the new educational trip leader program;
33 34 35 36	3. Simplifies the language relating to the new educational trip leader program and removes the advisory committee established in the bill and instead provides that the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife must adopt rules to implement the program, including establishing an advisory committee to advise the commissioner on the program;
37 38	4. Changes the penalty that applies if a person who is not a guide conducts an outdoor educational trip without an educational trip leader permit from a criminal to a civil penalty;
39 40	5. Provides that the renewal fee for an educational trip leader permit is \$20 rather than \$15; and

Correctional and Judicial Impact Statements

The additional workload associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system does not require additional funding at this time.

The collection of additional fine and/or fee revenue will increase General Fund and dedicated revenue by minor amounts.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill creates an educational trip leader permit with a 5-year term and a \$20 fee. No estimate is made at this time of the number of new permits that will be issued, but the impact on revenues is not anticipated to be significant. Any additional costs to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife or the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry as a result of the provisions of this bill are anticipated to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
