3	SUMMARY
4	This amendment makes the following of changes to the bill.
5 6	1. It simplifies the reporting requirements for the Department of Health and Human Services on its website regarding waiting lists for individuals for certain waiver services.
7 8 9 10	2. It removes language specifying that persons from immigrant and indigenous populations participate in developing the plan and replaces it with language specifying that persons reflecting a diversity of ethnicity, race and gender participate in developing the plan.
11 12	3. It removes a number of provisions in the bill related to the specifics of the commissioner's plan.
13	4. It removes a provision in the bill related to service delivery requirements.
14 15 16	5. It removes from the bill a requirement for the department to submit a waiver renewal or amendment to separate community support into tiered services as this has already occurred.
17 18	6. It removes a requirement that a waiver renewal or amendment be submitted to add a so-called "behavioral add-on."
