States of emergency 16 During a health-related state of emergency under Title 37-B, chapter 13, subchapter 2, a superintendent shall administer and adhere to all executive orders and proclamations by 17 the Governor and any guidance or directives from the director of the Maine Center for 18 19 Disease Control and Prevention within the Department of Health and Human Services and shall send a monthly report while the state of emergency is in effect to the director detailing 20 21 the steps that the school administrative unit is taking to comply with the guidance or directives and any health-related executive order or proclamation by the Governor, 22 23 including the number of students and staff affected by the health-related state of emergency, the number of cases of a disease or health issue occurring in the school administrative unit 24 and any steps taken by the school administrative unit to comply with the guidance, 25 26 directive, executive order or proclamation. A copy of the report required by this section must be sent to the school board of that school administrative unit. 27 28 Sec. 2. Reimbursement. The Department of Education shall develop a process to provide reimbursement to school administrative units for monthly reporting required under 29 the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 1056 during a health-related state of 30 31 emergency. 14 15 16 17 18	This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, strikes the emergency preamble, the COVID-19 pandemic guidance and requirements and the emergency clause. It also removes the requirement that school superintendents report any cleaning, sanitizing or segregation undertaken to comply with guidance or with a directive, proclamation or executive order during a health-related state of emergency.					
19 20 21 22	The amendment also adds an appropriation to provide funds for 90% of the costs to local school administrative units and directs the Department of Education to develop a process to provide reimbursement to school administrative units for the monthly reporting required during a health-related state of emergency.

Requires local school administrative units (SAU's) to submit monthly reports to the director of the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention within the Department of Health and Human Services detailing the steps that the SAU is taking to comply with the guidance or directives and any health-related executive order or proclamation by the Governor while a health-related state of emergency is in effect.

The required local activities in this bill may represent a state mandate pursuant to the Constitution of Maine. If the bill does require a local unit of government to expand or modify its activities so as to necessitate additional expenditures from local revenue, the state mandate provisions of the Constitution of Maine require either: (1) General Fund appropriations be provided to fund at least 90% of any additional necessitated local costs of the mandate; or (2) a Mandate Preamble be added to the bill and two-thirds of the members of each House vote to exempt the mandate from the funding requirement. If the bill does represent a state mandate and neither one of these actions occurs, the local units of government will not be required to implement the mandated activities.

### Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill includes ongoing General Fund appropriations of \$72,348 in fiscal year 2021-22 and \$74,663 in fiscal year 2022-23 to a newly created Health-related State of Emergency - School Reporting Requirement program within the Department of Education to reimburse local SAU's for the costs to prepare and submit monthly reports to the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention detailing the steps the SAU is taking to comply with the guidance or directives issued by the Governor during a health-related state of emergency. This fiscal note assumes it will take 1 hour to prepare the original report and one half-hour to update the report for each school administrative unit for each month that school is in session. Any unspent balances at the end of a fiscal year will lapse to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund.
