Presented by Representative GRAMLICH of Old Orchard Beach. Cosponsored by Representatives: DODGE of Belfast, SYLVESTER of Portland. **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, currently the COVID-19 pandemic is widespread in the State; and

Whereas, the pandemic has created severe health and safety concerns in the schools of the State; and

Whereas, school administrative units have been left to themselves to interpret and administer public health guidelines issued by the Governor and the Department of Health and Human Services, Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention; and

Whereas, the patchwork of inconsistent public health practices in the schools is endangering the health of students, their families and communities as schools continue to provide instruction to complete the school year; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §1056 is enacted to read:

§1056. States of emergency

During a health-related state of emergency under Title 37-B, chapter 13, subchapter 2, a superintendent shall administer and adhere to all executive orders and proclamations by the Governor and any guidance or directives from the director of the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention within the Department of Health and Human Services and shall send a monthly report while the state of emergency is in effect to the director detailing the steps that the school administrative unit is taking to comply with the guidance or directives and any health-related executive order or proclamation by the Governor, including the number of students and staff affected by the health-related state of emergency, the number of cases of a disease or health issue occurring in the school administrative unit and any cleaning, sanitizing, segregation or other steps taken by the school administrative unit to comply with the guidance, directive, executive order or proclamation. A copy of the report required by this section must be sent to the school board of that school administrative unit.

- **Sec. 2. COVID-19 pandemic guidance and requirements.** Pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 1056, during the state of emergency under Title 37-B, chapter 13, subchapter 2 regarding the COVID-19 pandemic, a school superintendent shall:
- 1. Communicate to every school and facility within the superintendent's school administrative unit the definitions of "deep cleaning" and "sanitizing" issued or approved by the Department of Health and Human Services, Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention and ensure that all surfaces and areas within those schools and facilities are cleaned and sterilized in a manner determined adequate by the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention;

- 2. Ensure that a ventilation system in a school or facility used or occupied by school administrative unit staff or a student is adequate to protect the staff or student as determined by the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention;
- 3. Ensure that all staff, students and others within a school administrative unit school or facility are properly wearing personal protective equipment as determined by the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention; and
- 4. Report compliance with the provisions of subsections 1, 2 and 3 pursuant to Title 20-A, section 1056.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.

11 SUMMARY

This bill requires school superintendents, during a health-related state of emergency, to comply with any health-related executive orders and proclamations made by the Governor and any directives and guidance issued by the director of the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention within the Department of Health and Human Services and, while the state of emergency is in effect, send a monthly report, copied to the school board, on all the steps the school administrative unit is taking to comply with any health-related executive order, proclamation, directive or guidance.
