Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment provides that a producer is exempt from the requirements of the packaging stewardship law if the producer sold, offered for sale or distributed for sale in or into the State during the prior calendar year to retailers or direct to consumers products that were perishable food and that were contained, protected, delivered, presented or distributed in or using less than 15 tons of packaging material in total. The amendment removes language requiring reimbursement to participating municipalities for costs incurred in the disposal of packaging material that is not readily recyclable. The amendment designates as major substantive rules any rules adopted by the Department of Environmental Protection to exclude certain packaging material from the definition of "packaging material." The amendment removes the prohibition on the sale, offering for sale or distribution for sale in or into the State by a retailer of a product contained, protected,
