11 Person in Danger"

Amend the amendment in section 1 in subsection 4 in the 5th line (page 1, line 22 in
13 amendment) by striking out the following: ", and the possessor of the location information"
14 and inserting the following: ', and the possessor of the location information'

Amend the amendment in section 1 in subsection 4 in the 7th line (page 1, line 24 in
16 amendment) by inserting after the following: "delay" the following: 'does not believe the
17 request is made in bad faith'

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or
19 section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment amends Committee Amendment "A" to provide that, when imminent
20 danger of death or serious physical injury is present, the possessor of the location
21 information must provide the information to the governmental requester as long as the
22 possessor of the location information does not believe the request is made in bad faith.
