The board, in consultation with the Department 14 of Administrative and Financial Services, Office of Information Technology, shall develop 15 and administer a comprehensive online pesticide sales and use registry for documenting 16 and quantifying pesticide sales, distribution and application in the State by licensed general 17 use pesticide dealers, licensed pesticide dealers and certified applicators using information 18 reported under section 1471-G. 19 2. Pesticide dealers. Beginning January 1, 2023, a general use pesticide dealer and a 20 pesticide dealer licensed to sell pesticides in the State shall maintain a record of a sale or 21 distribution of a pesticide. Beginning February 15, 2023 and for every month thereafter, a 22 general use pesticide dealer and a pesticide dealer licensed to sell pesticides in the State 23 24 shall submit to the board's online pesticide sales and use registry under subsection 1 a report of all sales and distributions of pesticides made by the dealer for the preceding month as 25 required by sections 1471-G and 1471-W and as required by the board by rule. 26 3. Applicators. Beginning January 1, 2023, a certified applicator shall submit to the 27 board's online pesticide sales and use registry under subsection 1 a report of all record-28 keeping data relating to an application of a pesticide as required by the board by rule within 29 one week after the application. 30 4. Rules. The board shall adopt rules to carry out the purposes of this section. Rules 31 adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 32 375, subchapter 2-A. 33

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the minority report, strikes the requirement that the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Board of Pesticides Control post information received by pesticide distributors and applicators on a publicly accessible website maintained by the board. The amendment strikes from the bill the list of information required of pesticide distributors to submit to the board's online pesticide sales and use registry as most of this information is currently required by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 1471-W and by the board by rule. The amendment strikes from the bill the list of information applicators must submit to the board's online pesticide sales and use registry as all record-keeping data is currently required by the board by rule. The amendment also strikes the provision that a certified applicator using integrated pest management may submit a report to the board on the day of the application if an immediate

threat to an agricultural crop arises and a day in application would result in significantly more damage to the crop or require a more extensive application of a pesticide or use of a more toxic pesticide. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill directs the Board of Pesticides Control (BPC) within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to develop and administer a comprehensive online pesticide sales and use registry for documenting and quantifying pesticide sales, distribution and application in the State. The BPC has indicated it will require additional staffing and resources to develop and maintain the registry. The bill includes ongoing General Fund appropriations to the BPC of \$696,786 beginning in fiscal year 2021-22 and \$729,786 in fiscal year 2022-23 for one Environmental Specialist IV position and seven Environmental Specialist II positions and associated costs. The bill also includes a one-time appropriation of \$250,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 and \$300,000 in fiscal year 2022-23 to develop the online registry and ongoing appropriations of \$50,000 beginning in fiscal year 2023-24 to maintain the registry.
