It borrows from the definition of "restorative justice program" in the Maine Juvenile Code to define "restorative justice" as used by the Office of Victim Services within the Department of Corrections. The Office of Victim Services is already responsible for assisting victims with obtaining victim compensation, restitution and other benefits of restorative justice.
