9 10 11	COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 511, L.D. 1618, "Resolve, To Place a Temporary Moratorium on the Approval of Any New Motor Vehicle Registration Plates and Initiate a Registration Plate Working Group"
12 13 14	Amend the resolve in the 2nd paragraph after the title in the 2nd line (page 1, line 4 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "manufacture" and inserting the following: 'manufacturing'
15 16	Amend the resolve in the 5th paragraph after the title in the first line (page 1, line 12 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "could" and inserting the following: 'may'
17 18	Amend the resolve by striking out everything after the emergency preamble and before the emergency clause and inserting the following:
19 20 21 22 23 24 25	Secretary of State, Bureau of Motor Vehicles, notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29-A, sections 468 and 468-A, may not approve any specialty or recognition plate sponsor to begin the specialty or recognition plate signature gathering process, bring forth enabling legislation or otherwise initiate any new designs, redesigns or additional registration plates other than already approved and enacted for a period of 2 years from the effective date of this resolve.
26 27 28 29	Sec. 2. Registration plate working group. Resolved: That the Department of the Secretary of State, Bureau of Motor Vehicles shall convene a working group, referred to in this section as "the working group," to study the proliferation of registration plates in accordance with this section.
30 31	1. Membership. Notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the working group consists of 10 members as follows:
32 33	A. One member appointed by the President of the Senate from the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation;
34 35	B. One member appointed by the President of the Senate representing a state agency that is a recipient of funds generated by the sale of specialty license plates;

1 2	C. One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives from the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation;
3 4 5	D. One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives representing a municipality or other political subdivision of the State engaged in the registration of motor vehicles on behalf of the State; and
6 7 8	E. One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives who is responsible for overseeing the manufacture of registration plates in the State Prison pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29-A, section 451, subsection 6;
9	F. The Chief of the State Police or the chief's designee; and
10 11	G. The Secretary of State or the secretary's designee and the following representatives from the Department of the Secretary of State:
12 13	(1) The Deputy Secretary of State for the Bureau of Motor Vehicles or the deputy's designee;
14 15	(2) One member appointed by the Secretary of State from the Bureau of Motor Vehicles technology and information services staff; and
16 17	(3) One member appointed by the Secretary of State from the Bureau of Motor Vehicles who is responsible for oversight of motor vehicle registrations
18 19 20	The President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives shall seek recommendations from the cochairs of the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation when making appointments under this subsection.
21 22 23	2. Compensation. Notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, members of the working group may not be compensated for their work on the working group, but legislative members may receive the legislative per diem.
24	3. Duties. Duties of the working group include:
25 26	A. Identifying and documenting the roles and functions of the State's registration plates;
27 28	B. Exploring and documenting challenges in the registration plate manufacturing process;
29 30 31	C. Exploring the challenges of storing and securing registration plate inventories in municipalities and other political subdivisions of the State and in branch offices of the Bureau of Motor Vehicles;
32 33	D. Examining the benefits, detriments and legal issues arising from specialty registration plates;
34	E. Examining competing interests with specialty registration plates;
35 36	F. Examining standards and systems developed by national and industry experts and exploring ways in which the State can adopt such standards and systems; and
37	G. Making recommendations based on the findings of the working group.
38 39 40	4. Staff assistance. Notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the Department of the Secretary of State, Bureau of Motor Vehicles shall provide necessary staffing services to the working group. Legislative Council staff support is not authorized.

The Bureau of Motor Vehicles shall provide a report by February 1, 2022 containing the findings and recommendations of the working group to the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation. The Joint Standing Committee on Transportation may introduce legislation for presentation to the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature based on the recommendations in the report.'
6 7	Amend the resolve by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.
8	SUMMARY
9	This amendment:
10 11	1. Removes the prohibition on the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation's consideration of specialty plate legislation;
12 13 14 15	2. Increases the size of the working group to 10 members and requires that certain working group appointments be made by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives instead of the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation, but requires that the chairs of the committee be consulted regarding appointments;
16	3. Clarifies that legislative members are eligible for the legislative per diem;
17 18	4. Clarifies that the Department of the Secretary of State, Bureau of Motor Vehicles provides staff assistance to the working group and not the Legislative Council;
19 20	5. Clarifies provisions regarding the report to the Joint Standing Committee or Transportation; and
21	6. Makes other technical changes to the resolve.

The general operating expenses of this study are projected to be \$1,000 in fiscal year 2021-22. The Legislature's budget for the 2022-2023 biennium includes \$10,000 in fiscal year 2021-22 and \$10,000 in fiscal year 2022-23 for the costs of legislative studies, as well as \$21,260 of balances carried over from prior years for this purpose.
