All public schools shall continue to distribute paper applications for school meals to all students. A public school is solely responsible for processing that school's online applications. Data submitted through the Internet-based application may not be visible to the department and must be transmitted directly to the applicable public school. <u>All public schools shall accept data submitted through the Internet-based application.</u>				

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Sec. 2. Department of Education to study free and reduced-price meals for publicly funded students at private schools approved for tuition purposes. The Department of Education shall conduct an analysis to determine the cost for the State to provide funding equal to the difference between the federal reimbursement for free and reduced-price breakfast and lunch under the national school breakfast and lunch programs in accordance with 7 Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 210 and 220 (2007) for each publicly funded student who:

- 8 1. Attends a private school approved for tuition purposes that enrolls 60% or more
 9 publicly funded students; and
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2. Is ineligible for a free or reduced-price breakfast and lunch.

11 The Department of Education shall submit a report with its findings to the joint 12 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters no later 13 than February 1, 2023. The joint standing committee having jurisdiction over education 14 matters may submit legislation based on the report to the 131st Legislature in 2023.''

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18 This amendment strikes the provisions of Committee Amendment "A." The 19 amendment requires that public schools accept data submitted through an Internet-based 20 application for free or reduced-priced meals under the National School Lunch Program and 21 the School Breakfast Program.

SUMMARY

The amendment also requires the Department of Education to investigate the cost of providing free and reduced-priced meals for publicly funded students at certain private schools approved for tuition purposes who are otherwise ineligible to receive free and reduced-price meals and report back to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over-education matters no later than February 1, 2023.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment strikes certain language in the bill and eliminates the ongoing General Fund appropriations of \$34,021,267 per year beginning in fiscal year 2022-23.

This amendment requires the Department of Education to investigate the cost of providing free and reduced priced meals for publicly-funded students at town academies who are otherwise ineligible to receive free and reduced-price meals and report back to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs no later than February 1, 2023. It also requires public schools to accept data submitted through an Internet-based application for free or reduced-price meals under the National School Lunch Program and the School Breakfast program.

As amended, the additional costs to the Department of Education and to local school administrative units to implement the requirements of this legislation can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
