13 14	'Sec. 2. Panel membership. Resolved: That, notwithstanding Joint Rule 353, the panel consists of 17 members who are residents of this State and appointed as follows:					
15 16 17 18	1. Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate from the part holding the largest number of seats in the Senate. In making the appointments pursuant t this subsection, the President of the Senate shall endeavor to appoint members havin expertise in areas or backgrounds listed in section 6;					
19 20 21 22	2. One member of the Senate appointed by the Senate Minority Leader from the part holding the 2nd largest number of seats in the Senate. In making the appointment pursuant to this subsection, the Senate Minority Leader shall endeavor to appoint a member havin expertise in areas or backgrounds listed in section 6;					
23 24 25 26	3. Three members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of th House from the party holding the largest number of seats in the House. In making th appointments pursuant to this subsection, the Speaker of the House shall endeavor t appoint members having expertise in areas or backgrounds listed in section 6;					
27 28 29 30	4. Three members of the House of Representatives appointed by the House Minorit Leader from the party holding the 2nd largest number of seats in the House. In making the appointments pursuant to this subsection, the House Minority Leader shall endeavor trappoint members having expertise in areas or backgrounds listed in section 6;

The Presiding Officers and minority leaders shall fill any vacancy according to the requirements of section 2, subsections 1, 2, 16 17 3 and 4.1 18 Amend the resolve by striking out all of section 7 and inserting the following: 19 'Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 6, 2023, the panel shall 20 submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over 21 22 health and human services matters. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having 23 jurisdiction over health and human services matters is authorized to report out legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.' 24 25 Amend the resolve by inserting after section 8 the following: 26 Appropriations and allocations. 2 3 4	This amendment makes the following changes to the Advisory Panel To Bette Understand and Make Recommendations Regarding the Implications of Genome-editing Technology for the Citizens of the State established in the resolve.
5	1. It requires members appointed to the panel to be Maine residents.
6 7 8	2. It requires the legislative members of the panel who are members of the 2nd larges party to be appointed by the minority leaders rather than the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
9 10	3. It changes the date the report is to be submitted from December 31, 2023 to December 6, 2023 to comply with the Joint Rules.
11 12 13	4. It specifies that the report is submitted to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters and the committee is authorized to report out legislation.
14 15	5. It clarifies that the legislative appointments must be current members of th Legislature.
16	The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.
