Report. Resolved: That, no later than November 2, 2022, the Department 19 of Education, in collaboration with the Department of Health and Human Services, shall submit a report, including suggested legislation, on the development of the comprehensive 20 system for MaineCare reimbursement under section 1 to the joint standing committee of 21 22 the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters. The joint standing committee 23 is authorized to submit legislation related to the report to the 131st Legislature in 2023. 24 Amend the resolve by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or 25 section number to read consecutively. **SUMMARY** 26 27 This amendment requires the Department of Education to collaborate with the Department of Health and Human Services in its development of a comprehensive system 28 29 that will support, in addition to school districts, the State's intermediate educational unit 30 currently known as the Child Development Services System and special-purpose private 31 schools in seeking reimbursement for MaineCare-eligible services for all children from 32 birth to grade 12. 33 FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED 34 (See attached)
