Department of Labor to examine recruitment and retention 16 programs and incentives for public safety workers. Resolved: That the 17 Department of Labor, in consultation with the Maine Fire Protection Services Commission, 18 the Maine Sheriffs' Association, the Maine Criminal Justice Academy, the Maine 19 Ambulance Association, the Maine Municipal Association and the Finance Authority of 20 Maine, shall develop a definition of "public safety worker," which must include, but is not 21 limited to, law enforcement personnel, firefighters and emergency medical services 22 personnel, and examine programs and incentives for recruitment and retention of such 23 24 public safety workers. In examining such programs and incentives, the Department of Labor shall identify 25 programs and incentives used for the purpose of recruitment and retention of public safety 26 workers in this State and in other states and evaluate the effect such programs and 27 incentives have on recruitment and retention, or the estimated effect such programs and 28 incentives may have if implemented. Such programs and incentives may include, but are 29 not limited to, student loan repayment, mortgage loan or interest rate relief, hiring 30 incentives, benefits such as group health insurance plans or retirement plans or payment 31

Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That the Department of Labor shall submit a report, including suggested legislation, to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over innovation, development, economic advancement and business matters and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over labor and

housing matters by January 15, 2023. The joint standing committees may each report out a bill based on the report to the First Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.

17 SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve directing the Department of Labor, in consultation with the Maine Fire Protection Services Commission, the Maine Sheriffs' Association, the Maine Criminal Justice Academy, the Maine Ambulance Association, the Maine Municipal Association and the Finance Authority of Maine, to develop a definition for "public safety worker" and to examine programs and incentives for recruitment and retention of such public safety workers. The department is required to submit a report, including suggested legislation, to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over innovation, development, economic advancement and business matters and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over labor and housing matters by January 15, 2023. The joint standing committees may each report out a bill based on the report to the First Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill includes a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$125,000 in fiscal year 2022-23 to the Workforce Research program within the Department of Labor for the cost associated with hiring an outside contractor to research and evaluate recruitment and retention programs and incentives for public safety workers and prepare the required report.

Additional costs to the Department of Public Safety, the Finance Authority of Maine and the Maine Fire Protection Services Commission associated with consulting on the examination can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
