An Act To Clarify the Boundary between Waldo County and Knox County in Penobscot Bay

(EMERGENCY)

Presented by Senator CURRY of Waldo. Cosponsored by Representative ZEIGLER of Montville and Representative: DODGE of Belfast. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, during the most recent census, the United States Department of Commerce, United States Census Bureau contacted Waldo County about a discrepancy with the common boundary line between Waldo County and Knox County in Penobscot Bay, and this discrepancy must be resolved; and

Whereas, Public Law 1828, chapter 372, which established Waldo County, established the southern boundary of the county as a line due east from the southern corner of the boundary line of the newly established Waldo County at approximately Jameson Point, along the town lines of Rockland and Camden, and across Penobscot Bay to where it met the Hancock County line; and

Whereas, the southern boundary line of Waldo County established in Public Law 1828, chapter 372 crossed Penobscot Bay south of the entire archipelago of Islesboro at approximately N 44° 06' 56"; and

Whereas, Public Law 1860, chapter 146, which established Knox County, designated numerous municipalities and plantations from Waldo County and Lincoln County to the newly established Knox County, but was silent on the common border with Waldo County in Penobscot Bay; and

Whereas, beginning in the 1940s, maps indicated the boundary line between Waldo County and Knox County in Penobscot Bay at approximately N 44° 12' 18", just south of Lime Island, which had the effect of dividing the archipelago of Islesboro between the 2 counties; and

Whereas, having timely clarification of and certainty about the common boundary between Waldo County and Knox County is essential for the residents of the counties, the next census and the creation of accurate maps of the counties; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- **Sec. 1. Boundary line.** Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a portion of the boundary line between Waldo County and Knox County in Penobscot Bay is as described:
- 1. Beginning at a point located at N 44° 9' and W 68° 56.45' in a northeasterly direction and continuing through N 44° 12.18' and W 68° 54.05';
- 2. Beginning at a point located at N 44° 9' and W 68° 56.45' in a westerly direction to a point located at N 44° 9' and W 68° 59.33'; and
- 3. Beginning at a point located at N 44° 9' and W 68° 59.33' in a northwesterly direction and continuing through N 44° 12.63' and W 69° 0.79'.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.
