An Act To Amend the Finance Authority of Maine Act To Allow for Remote Meetings

(EMERGENCY)

- 1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
- Whereas, Public Law 2021, chapter 290, An Act Regarding Remote Participation in
 Public Proceedings, does not apply to public bodies such as the Finance Authority of Maine
 to which specific statutory provisions for remote participation already apply; and
- 6 **Whereas,** the Finance Authority of Maine prefers to have the new law apply to its 7 proceedings instead of the older, more limited statute governing emergency board meetings 8 in certain cases; and
- 9 Whereas, there is a need to have in place a law that governs remote participation in 10 public proceedings of the Finance Authority of Maine after the termination of the state of 11 emergency declared by the Governor pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 37-B, 12 section 742 in response to the public health emergency caused by the spread of the novel 13 coronavirus disease referred to as COVID-19; and
- Whereas, members of the Finance Authority of Maine inhabit various parts of the
 State and may need or wish, based on public health or other considerations such as severe
 weather, to conduct business remotely as soon as possible; and
- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within
 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as
 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
 therefore,
- 21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 22 Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §971, as amended by PL 1995, c. 117, Pt. C, §1, is further 23 amended to read:
- 24 §971. Actions of the members
- 25 Seven members of the authority constitute a quorum of the members. The affirmative 26 vote of the greater of 5 members, present and voting, or a majority of those members 27 present and voting is necessary for any action taken by the members. No <u>A</u> vacancy in the 28 membership of the authority may <u>does not</u> impair the right of the quorum to exercise all 29 powers and perform all duties of the members.
- 30Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in a situation determined by the chief31executive officer to be an emergency requiring action of the members on not more than 332days' oral notice, an emergency meeting of the members may be conducted by telephone33in accordance with the following.
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 1. Placement of call. A conference call to the members must be placed by ordinary
 35 commercial means at an appointed time.
- 36 **2. Record of call.** The authority shall arrange for recordation of the conference call
 37 when appropriate and prepare minutes of the emergency meeting.
- 38 **3. Notice of emergency meeting.** Public notice of the emergency meeting must be
 39 given in accordance with Title 1, section 406 and that public notice must include the time
 40 of the meeting and the location of a telephone with a speakerphone attachment that enables
- 41 all persons participating in the telephone meeting to be heard and understood and that is

- available for members of the public to hear the business conducted at the telephone
 meeting.
- 3 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation
 4 takes effect when approved.
 - SUMMARY

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6 This bill strikes the current provisions in law governing certain emergency meetings of 7 the Finance Authority of Maine, thereby making the remote meetings provisions of Public 8 Law 2021, chapter 290 applicable to the authority.
