An Act To Continue Supporting Safe Drinking Water for Maine Families

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Grants for well water abatement. The Maine State Housing Authority shall provide grants to eligible owners of single-family homes or landlords with private well water that shows evidence of contamination. For purposes of this section, "contamination" means that the level of microorganisms, disinfectants, disinfection byproducts, inorganic chemicals, organic chemicals or radionuclides exceeds maximum contaminant levels for public water systems established by the national primary drinking water regulations, 40 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 141, or similar standards applicable to public water systems in the State pursuant to state law or rule, and "private well water" means water from a private drinking water well as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1392, subsection 8.

Sec. 2. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

SUMMARY

This bill provides one-time funding for the treatment of contaminated private drinking water wells.
