1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 34-A MRSA §3032, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:
3 4	2-A. Prone and supine restraints, chemical sprays and electroshock devices prohibited. Prone and supine restraints, chemical sprays and electroshock devices may
5	not be used on any juvenile detained at or committed to a correctional facility. As used in
6 7	this subsection, "electroshock device" means a device that uses an electric current to temporarily incapacitate a person.
8	SUMMARY
9	This bill prohibits the use of prone and supine restraints, chemical sprays and
10 11	electroshock devices on juveniles detained at or committed to a correctional facility that is under the jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections.
