9 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 1501, L.D. 2019, "An Act To Require 10 the Registration of Adjuvants in the State and To Regulate the Distribution of Pesticides 11 with Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 22-A in the last 3 lines (page 1, lines 4 to 6 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "means substances that include any member of the class of fluorinated organic chemicals containing at least 2 fully fluorinated carbon atoms" and inserting the following: 'has the same meaning as in Title 32, section 1732, subsection 5-A'

Amend the bill in section 2 in subsection 25 by inserting after paragraph C thefollowing:

- 19 '<u>"Pesticide" includes a highly toxic pesticide.</u>'
- 20 Amend the bill by striking out all of section 3 and inserting the following:

'Sec. 3. 7 MRSA §604, sub-§31-A is enacted to read:

31-A. Spray adjuvant. "Spray adjuvant" means any wetting agent, spreading agent, sticker, deposit builder, adhesive, emulsifying agent, deflocculating agent, water modifier or similar agent that is intended to be used with any other pesticide as an aid to the application or the effect of it and that is in a package or container separate from that of the other pesticide.'

- Amend the bill in section 4 in subsection 1 by striking out all of paragraph I (page 2, lines 5 to 7 in L.D.) and inserting the following:
- 'I. Beginning January 1, 2030, a pesticide that contains intentionally added PFAS that
   may not be sold or distributed pursuant to Title 38, section 1614, subsection 5,
   paragraph D.'
- 32 Amend the bill by inserting after section 6 the following:
- 33 'Sec. 7. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and
   34 allocations are made.

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment changes the definition of perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl
substances or PFAS to mean substances that include any member of the class of fluorinated
organic chemicals containing at least one fully fluorinated carbon atom rather than 2 fully
fluorinated carbon atoms as in the bill.

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " to H.P. 1501, L.D. 2019

Current law defines a pesticide to include a highly toxic pesticide. The amendment adds this provision to the bill.

The amendment changes the definition of "spray adjuvant."

Because of the change in the definition of PFAS, the amendment clarifies that, beginning January 1, 2030, a person may not distribute in the State a pesticide that contains intentionally added PFAS that may not be sold or distributed under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1614, subsection 5, paragraph D.

### **Fiscal Detail and Notes**

This bill authorizes the Board of Pesticides Control (BPC) within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to regulate the use of spray adjuvants. It prohibits the use of pesticides that contain PFAS beginning January 1, 2030. The bill includes ongoing General Fund appropriations of \$188,552 beginning in fiscal year 2022-23 for one full-time Environmental Specialist III position, one part-time Environmental Specialist II position and related costs for the registration of adjuvants and maintenance of the database. The bill also includes ongoing allocations of \$1,761 beginning in fiscal year 2022-23 for position technology costs and STACAP expenses.
