An Act to Provide Postage Prepaid Return Envelopes to Voters Who Send Absentee Ballots by Mail

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §752, first ¶, as amended by PL 1985, c. 357, §8, is further amended to read:

At least 3 months before any election, the Secretary of State shall furnish each municipality with a reasonable number of dated absentee ballot applications. A reasonable time, not less than 30 days unless an emergency exists, before any election, the Secretary of State shall furnish each municipality with a reasonable number of absentee ballots and return envelopes, postage prepaid for return when the ballot is mailed from within the United States.

- **Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §752, sub-§3,** as amended by PL 2021, c. 398, Pt. UUUU, §2 and affected by §7, is further amended to read:
- **3. Form of return envelope.** The Secretary of State shall design or approve the form of the absentee ballot return envelope, <u>postage prepaid for return when the ballot is mailed from within the United States</u>. The Secretary of State may not design or approve a return envelope for use in a general election that includes any mark visible on the outside of the return envelope or a space designated for making a mark visible on the outside of the return envelope that indicates the political party of the voter to whom the absentee ballot is issued.
 - **Sec. 3.** Effective date. This Act takes effect March 1, 2024.

This bill provides for postage prepaid return envelopes for voters in the United States sending absentee ballots by mail.
