1 2	Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
3	Whereas, the federal FAFSA Simplification Act, Public Law 116-260, Sections 701
4	to 706 (2020) made significant changes to the underlying processes and methodologies for
5	determining federal student aid eligibility; and
6	Whereas, most of these provisions are scheduled to take effect on July 1, 2023; and
7	Whereas, the Maine State Grant Program, set forth in the Maine Revised Statutes,
8	Title 20-A, sections 11611 to 11619-A, relies in part on submission of the free application
9	for federal student aid and uses the outdated term "expected family contribution" in
10	determining awards; and
11 12	Whereas, if this legislation is not enacted on an emergency basis, the Maine State Grant Program will use an outdated term and risk confusing participants; and
13	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within
14	the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as
15	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,

1 **1. Priority for awards of grants.** Students with the lowest expected family 2 contributions student aid index must be given priority over all other eligible students for 3 the awards of grants.

4 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation 5 takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

This bill updates the Maine State Grant Program as a result of recently enacted federal
legislation pertaining to free application for federal student aid simplification and
associated terminology. It removes the term "expected family contribution" from the
governing laws and replaces it with "student aid index."
